Qué Pasa Hialeah

Dear Friends,

During this edition of Que Pasa Hialeah, I would like to remind our community that we are in the middle of hurricane season. I urge you to take the proper measures to protect yourself and your family from a possible hurricane threat. As Mayor of Hialeah, I assure you that the City is prepared for the 2011 hurricane season. Having a family plan and a supply kit is vital for hurricane preparedness. Below are several points I strongly encourage you to consider when preparing a personal plan.

- Identify a safe place to retreat to if asked to evacuate.
- Listen to NOAA Weather Radio, local radio or television stations for evacuation instructions.
- Take these items with you when evacuating:
 - 30 day supply of prescribed medication.
 - Bedding and clothing, including sleeping bags and pillows.
 - Bottled water, battery operated radio with extra batteries, first aid kit and flashlight.
 - Car keys and road maps.
 - Cash and / or travelers check
 - Documents, including driver's license, social security card, proof of residence, insurance policies, wills deeds, birth and marriage certificates, tax records, as well as family, work, and other important contact information.
 - Pet Supplies. If a pet shelter is needed, register your pet in advance for a designated shelter.
- Essential items needed during and after a hurricane:
 - First aid kit and essential medications, vitamins, fruits, vegetables, protein bars, and trail mix.
 - Ready to eat canned foods and juices, soups, non-refrigerated milk brands and a manual can opener.
 - A gallon of water per person per day.
 - Special items for infants, elderly, or family members with special needs.

Please remember to also protect your home and neighborhood by installing hurricane shutters or by purchasing precut 1/2" outdoor plywood boards for each window of your home. It is also important to make trees more wind resistant by removing diseased and damaged limbs. Finally, do not place any trash, tree trimmings, furniture, garbage cans, recycling bins or any other items that will present a hazard during high winds.

Please do not wait to take action! I encourage you to get started and plan today!

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Back To School Immunization: On August 9, 2011 Mayor Carlos Hernandez and the City Council in conjunction with the Miami-Dade County Health Department hosted a Back to School Immunization event at Goodlet Adult Center. The event was for children between the ages of 2 months and 18 years. All the children who attended the event received free immunizations.

The building will be city owned and operated, and will house tenants who apply through the Hialeah Housing Authority's affordable housing program.
