Dear Friends,

With this new issue of **Qué Pasa Hialeah**, I would like to take this opportunity to share with all of you events which have taken place in the last couple of weeks. The City continues to grow, as well as act in benefit of the entire community. In this edition of **Qué Pasa**, I would like to recognize the elderly population, as well as the initiatives the City has taken to assist the elderly during the difficult economic times our country presently faces. I invite all of you to join me in our upcoming events in support of your City.



Ground Breaking Ceremony for 36-unit Affordable Elderly Housing Project: On October 20, 2011 Mayor Carlos Hernandez and the City Council attended the ground breaking ceremony which will allow for the construction of a 36 unit affordable elderly rental housing project. This project was made possible through the utilization of federal grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP3) and HOME Program. This project is located at 355 East 32 Street in Hialeah, Florida and will encompass 36-one bedroom, one bath units. These units, as with all other City owned and operated facilities, will be occupied by low-income elderly who are selected from the existing Hialeah Housing Authority waiting list.

Eight New Transit Buses: On September 29, 2011 Mayor Carlos Hernandez and the City Council announced the addition of 8 new buses to the Hialeah Transit System Fleet. The Hialeah Transit System consists of 13 buses of which 9 operate daily from 6 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. With the addition of these new 8 buses, the residents and users will be



able to enjoy the comforts and reliability of such new buses. The Hialeah Transit System covers two routes, the Flamingo and the Marlin, which have helped over 2.5 million passengers find their way through Hialeah during the past 9 years. All of the buses are handi-cap accessible and are equipped with bike racks. The buses are checked and serviced daily by mechanics, which helps reduce route delays greatly .
